The Library Publishing Coalition

 Community-driven membership association of libraries engaged in publishing

- 3 different roles:
 - Provide a community of practice (listserv, annual conference, etc.)
 - Create resources to support library publishers
 - Represent library publishers



The Library Publishing Coalition

- Membership is open to all academic and research libraries and library consortia that have or are considering library publishing programs
- 80 member libraries as of February 2019
- Members in U.S., Canada, Ireland, U.K., and Australia
- Membership year runs from July to June

The Library Publishing Curriculum Why a curriculum?

- Library publishers are mostly self-taught
- Existing professional development is piecemeal
- There's a need for deep, systematic instruction for professionals and LIS students



The Library Publishing Curriculum What is the curriculum?

- A set of teaching materials, including narratives, slides, instructor guides, and supplementary materials
- Openly licensed (CC BY) for reuse and modification
- Designed to be used in classroom teaching and in virtual and in-person workshops



The Library Publishing Curriculum

How was it created?

- Two-year funded project (US Institute of Museum and Library Services grant)
- Investigated professional development needs
- Recruited teams of authors to create modules
- Peer reviewed, edited, and released the modules
- Currently being piloted



The Library Publishing Curriculum

What does it cover?

- Content: How do library publishers attract, select, edit, manage, and disseminate content?
- Impact: How can library publishers measure and extend the impact of their work?
- **Sustainability:** How do library publishing endeavors establish longevity and long-term success?
- Policy: How do library publishers infuse policy with library values?



The Library Publishing Curriculum Who is using it?

- Professional associations: LPC, the Open Textbook Network
- Professional development providers: PKP Publishing School
