# OsloMet and the University Library

# Oslo Metropolitan University in Norway

- 2200 employees and 20.000 students
- Roots in vocational colleges; educates teachers, nurses, engineers, librarians and many more

#### The University Library

- 4 libraries around campus
- 80 employees
- Section for Multimedia








3 existing journals running on Open Journals Systems (OJS) – no technical support

3 OsloMet departments wanted to start journals – no existing publishing platform



# The Start-Up - <a href="http://journals.hioa.no">http://journals.hioa.no</a>

- The University Library decided to run a publishing platform based on Open Journal Systems, which the existing journals already were familiar with
- If the editor is an employee of OsloMet our services are free
- We wanted to make it easier for our departments to publish journals, and to offer the technical support and practical skills needed to publish an academic journal
- Open Access Journals at OsloMet was launched in the Summer of 2011, with six published journals
- Our initial goal of offering only technical support quickly changed






#### Service level:


- User support for the editorial team
- Advice on peer review, name and domain selection, language selection, how to get financing, ISSN, level 1 approval in the Norwegian publishing system. Help with the first time setup of the article layout and reference lists
- We provide DOIs
- Training for editorial teams, attend editorial meetings if asked
- Arrange an annual meeting for editors, to discuss issues relevant ot all of our journals
- Advice and help with indexing and visibility
- Upload metadata to DOAJ (Directory of Open Access Journals)
- Delivery of annual statistics



# Changing the view of digital publishing

- Set bi-annual issues or continuous publishing?
- Continuous page numbers or eIDs?








# Journal publishing at a cost

- We offer free training for libraries in other institutions looking to publish journals
- We decided to open for requests from external journals as well
- We do no marketing at all
- Currently we publish 3 journals from other universities/university colleges in Norway





# Sustainability and pricing

- We regularly get requests for price quotes
- Our goal is to give a fair pricing for our services, to encourage competition in the Norwegian publishing industry
- Our pricing model is fairly simple:
   Divide the labour, social cost and other expenses spent on running 15 journals with 15

The bottom line and price per journal: 7200 euros
