



East Wales, United Kingdom

The East Wales region stretches between Wales' north and south coasts and includes the Welsh capital Cardiff. East Wales is the more densely populated of Wales' two NUTS 2 regions. For the current funding round 2014-2020, Wales has been allocated £2 billion in EU structural funds to be spent on such goals as urban regeneration and helping people back into work. Of the UK's four constituent nations. Wales is the biggest per capita beneficiary of EU funds.



Examples of projects and initiatives supported by the EU

 Cardiff City Deal: More than £100 million in EU funding has been committed between 2016 and 2023 to help deliver the first phase of a 'City Deal' for the Cardiff capital region, a 20-year scheme to improve th region's infrastructure and transport links.

 Helping disabled people into work: Between 2010 and 2014, the EU spent £9.2 million in a project led by Caerphilly County Borough Council on setting up social enterprises to provide work experience and ultimately vial del río Arlanzón v en medio ambiente de los burgaleses.



This contrasts with the traditional, linear economic model, which is based on a Take-mailconsume throw away (pattern. Moving towards a more circular economy could deliver benefits, including reduced pressure on the environment enhanced raw materials supplysecurity, and increased competitiveness.
